Well, we’ve had a couple of big years. In 2016, we celebrated our Society’s 25th anniversary – and this year it was our iconic festival’s turn to hit the quarter century! Both of those remarkable achievements and we know that without the support of our local community, neither may ever have happened.

PCT has been with us for quite a few years, we sincerely appreciate the support and are proud of our continuing relationship. PCT’s generous donation of \$3,000 this year to support our Festival funding made it possible for us to explore other educational and entertaining exhibits for our visitors on the day. Highlights of the 2017 Fingerling Festival include:

- An estimated 5,000 visitors on the day
- First Nations blessing of the fry as they were released into the creek
- 40,000 Chum Salmon fry released into Noons Creek
- Bobs & Lolo again wowed the young and young-at-heart with their singing!
- Vancouver Polish Theatre were again a huge hit with the kids!
- Our raffle table had over 35 generously donated raffle prizes including some fantastic art prints from the likes of Robert Bateman
- Our hotdog lunch this year was handled by the Tri-City Rotaractors and they did a fantastic job. This initiative made it possible for us to free up about 12 volunteer positions on the day. These could then help with more ecologically focused Festival

- Family groups were encouraged to volunteer (a great way to introduce volunteerism to young children)
