Q&A Ask a PCT Employee

Q: When and where is the event?

A: Our celebration is happening during Golden Spike Days on Saturday, July 3rd from 11:00am to 4:00pm. We'll be hosting the event on our site so people can meet our employees and see what our company is all about.

Q: How can we get there?

A: We are anticipating a large number of visitors to our event, so to ensure everyone's safety, we will not allow car access to our site. Instead, a **FREE bus shuttle** service from Rocky Point Park will transport visitors to and from our facility. Look for the shuttle booth near the parking lot at Rocky Point Park. Buses will run regularly from 11:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.

Q: Are there things to do for the kids?

A: We will have a number of family-friendly activities going on throughout the day to demonstrate the work we do and celebrate our special occasion! Visitors can take walking tours of our site, see some equipment in action and even explore a CP locomotive. We'll have crafts and activities, free hot dogs, and musical entertainment by a Navy band to commemorate the Navy's Centennial – and best of all, we'll be providing free scenic yacht tours of Burrard Inlet for everyone!
