Notice of Short-Term Marine Works

Pacific Coast Terminals (PCT) is informing the local community about two short-term improvements starting in August. All works will occur on or adjacent to the terminal.

The first marine works consists of the completion of the Reed Shoals, a constructed fish habitat located just west of Berth 1. Construction activities will occur at lower low tide to minimize turbidity and prospective impacts to fish. The Potash Project, including the shoals, was permitted by the Vancouver Fraser Port Authority.



The second marine works involve modifications to the dock faces of Berths 1 and 2. The works are necessary for the continued safe operation of the terminal. Key works will include replacement of old creosote treated piles (40) with new steel piles (17) and the removal of wood and concrete structures that will be replaced with pre-cast concrete. The pile driving work is currently scheduled for three days in August and two days in September. All work will be done from the water side. We will be using a derrick with a crane and material supply scows which will operate within a single berth face at a time.

Marine Works Construction Hours

Construction activities associated with completion of the shoals will occur from August 9-16, 7:00 am to 8:00 pm.

Berth improvements are scheduled from August 13 through to September 19, 2018. Selective work scheduling will proceed 24/7 with pile driving operations limited to between 7:00am and 8:00pm in compliance with the City of Port Moody bylaws.
