PCT and K+S POTASH CANADA Scholarship Program

Pacific Coast Terminals Co. Ltd. (PCT) and K+S Potash Canada have constructed a potash handling facility at PCT's marine terminal site in Port Moody. But our partnership doesn't stop there: we also share a commitment to the Port Moody community. K+S Potash Canada is pleased to be a part of PCT's scholarship program, which assists graduates within School District 43 to pursue Post-Secondary education.

Together, PCT and K+S Potash Canada is offering one \$1,500 scholarship for an Indigenous Student. The scholarship is applicable at any accredited **BC** university, college or other Post-Secondary institution. The funds are to be used for the cost of tuition, fees, books, and academic supplies.

Application **CRITERIA**

- Are enrolled at a Secondary school within School District 43.
- You must be from a BC First Nation or an Indigenous permanent resident of BC.
- Demonstrate leadership in academics, athletics, the community, or the arts.
- Maintain academic achievement sufficient for admission to a Post-Secondary institution.
- Selection is based on a combination of demonstrated leadership in academics, athletics, the community, or the arts, personal references and acceptance to a Post-Secondary institution.

Scholarship **DETAILS**

- Four \$1,500 scholarships will be awarded to students who are planning to pursue Post-Secondary studies.
- Deadline for receipt or postmark of application materials is Wednesday, **April 10th, 2024**.
- Late or incomplete applications will not be considered.
- ***It is highly encouraged that applications are emailed as one complete pdf file.*** Applications can also be faxed or mailed if this is not an option.
- Successful applicants will be notified by the middle of May.
- Successful scholarship recipients must be enrolled in a secondary school in the district and be accepted at an accredited Post-Secondary institution in BC in order to receive the scholarship.
- Scholarship recipients must be enrolled in full-time, Post-Secondary studies.
- Scholarships are awarded at the selection committee's sole discretion and all decisions are final.

Application **PROCESS**

- ***Submit transcripts*** of secondary school marks or predicted grades.
- ***Submit a reference letter*** from school counsellor, teacher, coach or other professional who can attest to character, personal values, extracurricular interests and hobbies, community involvement and any additional information which may be helpful in assessing the applicant.
- ***Submit an essay*** of maximum 500 words describing why you are deserving of the award. This can focus on academic and career goals, extracurricular activities and interests, hobbies, awards received and any other information that might be of interest to the selection committee. This is an opportunity to express yourself and tell us more about your achievements. Be creative.
- ***Submit a cover letter*** introducing yourself and describing reasons for attending Post-Secondary institution, program(s) applying for, and which school you are enrolling in.

A selection committee will review all completed applications. Selection is based on a combination of demonstrated leadership in academics, athletics, the community, or the arts, personal references and acceptance to a Post-Secondary institution in BC.
